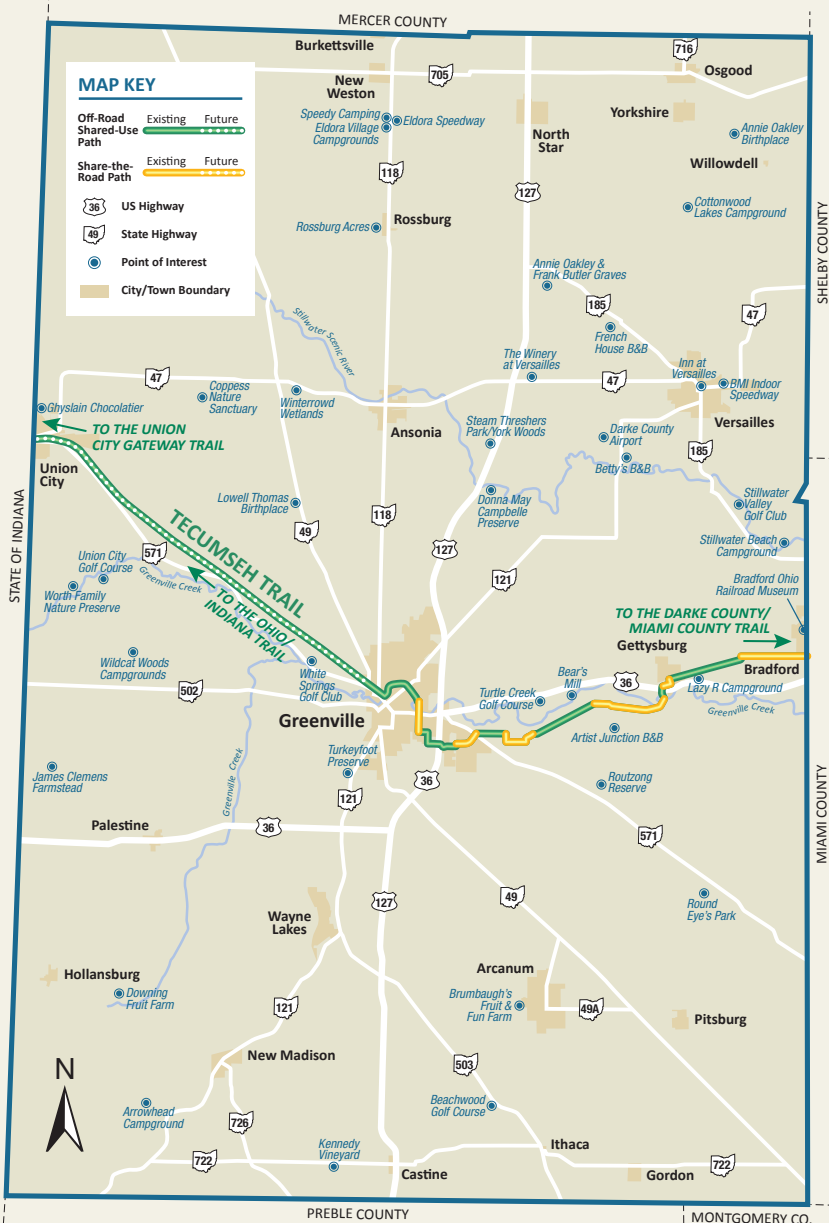

Biking on the Street

- State law requires that cyclists ride with the flow of traffic
- Signal your turns
- Keep to the right and ride only two abreast
- Ride in a straight line and avoid car doors
- Make left turns safely:
Like a car – move into left turn lane and turn left
Like a pedestrian – ride straight across street and use crosswalk

Biking on a Sidewalk or Shared-Use Path

- Ride slowly and yield to pedestrians
- Alert pedestrians of your presence before maneuvering around them – use a bell or say "passing on your left"
- Be careful at crossings
- Watch for cars pulling out of drives and intersecting streets

a tomahawk throwing competition, see apple butter cooked over the fire, chat with Johnny Appleseed, take a horse-drawn wagon ride, visit with pioneers in and around the Log House, compete in children's games, view local artists' creations, listen to live music, enjoy savory food and tasty treats, visit vendors displaying their wares, listen to tall-tales being spun, and make crafts pioneer-style. 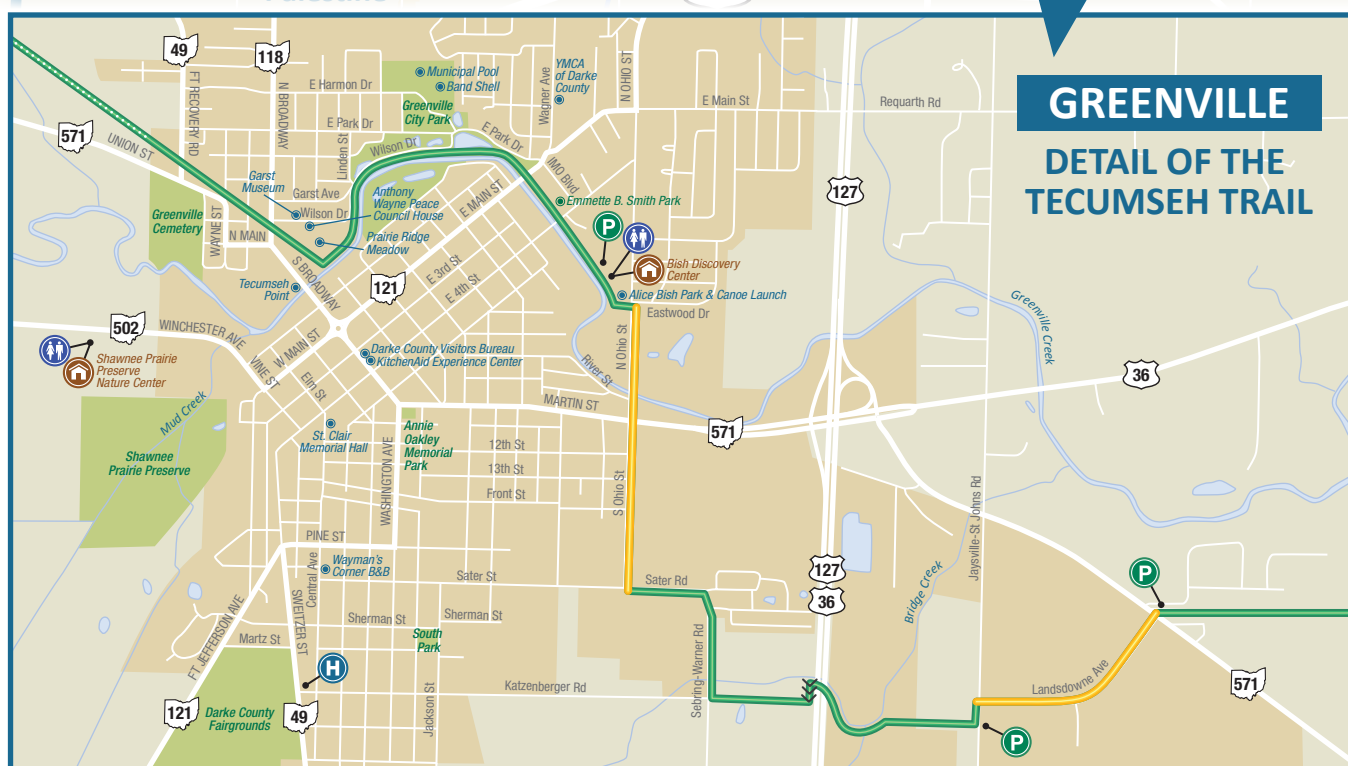
