In May 1994, Chalmer Bish donated over five acres of land along Greenville Creek for a park and walking trail. Named after his wife Alice, the park serves a dual role as a trailhead for both a paved multi-purpose trail and a nature walkway. Visitors can choose between a brisk pace along the paved trail or a casual peaceful walk through the woods. The park provides the ideal setting for a hike in any season, with nature and a scenic stream as your companions. The trail system provides access to Greenville City Park and further on to Prairie Ridge Meadow and Tecumseh Point. This park also offers a boat ramp, allowing paddling access to the creek.





BISH DISCOVERY CENTER

Opened in 2018, the Bish Discovery Center focuses on educating visitors about sustainable living, renewable energy and how to have a positive impact on the environment. You'll find sustainable living displays, a 1 acre pollinator field, 28 community gardens, solar panels and a permeable parking lot on the grounds to reinforce these ideas.

The center is also the District's hub for outdoor recreation. Bike, canoe and kayak rentals are available as well as water fountains, public restrooms, maps, visitor information, covered shelter, and more. Cyclists have access to the Tecumseh Trail & Bikeway, and paddling enthusiasts can launch their craft at a paved canoe and kayak launch for a float down Greenville Creek.
