Rich in historical significance, this 20-acre park has a recreated prairie seeded with 100 varieties of grasses and flowering plants native to Darke County and scenic trails that lead visitors through a woodland area along Greenville Creek. At the north end of the park sits the Anthony Wayne Peace Council House, a modern day reconstruction of the building where the Native American tribes signed the Treaty of Greene Ville with General Anthony Wayne. Just behind the council house in the meadow lined with 200-yearold oaks, is the site of the annual Gathering at Garst event. The Tecumseh Walkway, a paved trail featuring historically interpretive signage, leads visitors to the confluence of Greenville and Mud Creeks called Tecumseh Point where the famous Shawnee war chief may have protested the Treaty of Greenville. The park also provides an access point to the Tecumseh Trail & Bikeway.
