

Winterrowd Wetlands

LOCATION: Just east of OH-49 on OH-47

FEATURES:

- 60 acre preserve
- 35 acres of wetland, 5 acres of woods, 20 acres of prairie
- Hiking trails (.6 miles)
- · Wetland observation blind

Located in the headwaters of the Stillwater River, this 60-acre preserve provides a glimpse of Ohio as it was prior to settlement. It includes 35 acres of "pothole" wetland, 5 acres of upland woods and 20 acres of prairie. Access is restricted to a 1/4-mile trail that winds through the prairie to an observation blind overlooking the wetland. The pothole wetlands are an ideal birding area during spring and fall migration, and the prairie hosts many species of grassland nesting birds. Migrating birds, the songs of wetland creatures, and blooming prairie wildflowers make Winterrowd an experience to be treasured.
